The First Australian Electronic Media Arts Conference aims to address the mapping of a current topography within the electronic arts in Australia and its relation to international developments. The conference will introduce to academics and practitioners, recent research, progressions, concepts and applications within the fields of electronic arts. This includes a diversity of electronic sites, sound, music, video, computers and interactives. The identification of these sites is articulated through the means by which they are experienced; broadcast and other telecommunications, performance, electronic cinema, and public spaces.

The conference key note address will be given by Gene Youngblood, currently Scholar-In-Residence at the College of Santa Fe. He is completing the book title "Virtual Space: The challenge to create on the same scale as we destroy". The forum topics are as follows:

Electronic Arts Aesthetics & Society canvases contemporary philosophies of digital space, electronic cinema and techno-culture.

Questions of Materiality

presents some current theoretical and research perspectives concerning electronic media.

Practices of Broadcast & Exhibitions identifies emergent sites in telecommunications, broadcast, distribution and archival formats.

Composing Time & Space

explores applications of the computer in the technological arts.

The First Australian Media Arts Conference will also present a related exhibition of electronic works in the Domain Foyer. Amiga computer graphic video works including tapes by Ross Harley, Jason Gee, and Brad Miller are being exhibited. This exhibition will also include a Macintosh Hypercard driven interactive videodisc installation entitled "The Watch Detail" by Bill Seaman. An Amiga based installation created by Gary Warner will be presented on Sunday, November 4, from 12:00pm to 2:00 pm in the Domain Theatre.
