Sydney Intermedia Network has been providing services and support in the experimental film, video, performance and intermedia areas for over ten years. If your interest is in these areas and you don't already know what services we offer then take a look. SIN is an incorporated association with approximately 100 members and receives financial assistance from the Australian Film Commission. *Matinaze*, SIN's annual survey screening of Australian film and video art has just finished at the Art Gallery of New South Wales. If you missed it you can still see a selection of the Matinaze videos at the Australian Centre for Photography from 29 July to 21 August. Apart from Matinaze we organise a program of monthly screenings under the title SIN-E-SCOPE (see below), presenting a

broad selection of work for practitioners and anyone with an interest in the art of film and video. We also tour work nationally and internationally and will be curating film and video for this year's *PERSPECTA*.

Many of SIN's activities are open to non-members but there are some good reasons for becoming a member - take our equipment hire (over) for example, and SIN members also receive a 10% discount when using facilities at Metro TV. Membership is a good way of staying in touch, making contacts and supporting an organisation that is supporting your profession.
