Carpet Burns 1990-93: Lest We Forget

Joy Toma produces SBS TV's film and video program, Eat Carpet which can be seen late every Saturday night (following David Stratton's Cinema Classics). She has produced the program since 1993 and before that coproduced it with Annette Shun Wah.

From 1990-93 she was the series producer of Carpet Burns which was a weekly 5 to 10 minute segment of Eat Carpet. Carpet Burns commissioned independent film makers to look at the more unconventional aspects of the Australian arts scene from the director's eye. It was a bold initiative that moved beyond simply reporting on the arts to actively interpreting and shaping its form for the small screen. In its three years, 65 short stories varying in duration from 5 to 10 minutes were produced in a variety of formats and a long list of adventurous film and video makers from across Australia were commissioned to ensure an independent eye would be brought to the work of the artist.

The series, funded in part by the financial contribution of the Australia Council, will not be continuing in 1994. Why? What were the achievements of the initiative? What are the lessons learnt? How do the Carpet Burns stories measure up, on reflection?

Joy Toma will be screening a selection of the best of the series and address some of the above questions.

Filling the Gaps: Programming for a National System of Community TV Services.

Jeffrey Cook is the Metro Television Cable Project Co-ordinator and is a consultant to Telecom over the operation of The Community Channel, the locally originated community cable service that is part of the Telecom Centennial Park Cable TV Trial.

In the next 24 months dozens of new television services will be coming on line: cable, microwave, satellite and free-to-air. All have a voracious appetite for programming material. Besides many new commercial service, 3 year non-commercial narrowcasting licenses (under the new Broadcasting Act) have been issued to consortia of interest groups in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide and Lismore. Metropolitan-wide broadcasts in Sydney, Brisbane and Melbourne will commence sometime in the next 3 months. In addition, cable TV services are starting up, with the first test of non-profit community-based cable services being The Community Channel, a locally originated service operated as a collaboration between Metro TV and Telecom Australia, initially in the eastern suburbs of Sydney.

The major issue is how to support the programming, commissioning and acquisitions funds of these new non-commercial outlets for film and video work so that producers can get returns on their work.

Jeffrey Cook will discuss these changes to the conditions of distribution and exhibition and will show a few minutes of sample video produced at the channel.
