Short eNZ presents a cross-section of experimental films and videos from Aotearoa/New Zealand. It includes works by both new and established practitioners.

Peter Wells has been making films from the early 1980s and his work is important both for voicing a gay perspective, and for the way his films manipulate and play with narrative structures. His is one of the most consistent visions among NZ filmmakers.

Lisa Reihana is one of a new breed of Maori filmmakers. Living across Maori and Pakeha cultures, her work reflects her appreciation of Maori traditions, her European art school background, and her taste for popular culture.

Annie Goldson has been teaching and making political and experimental documentaries in the USA for over ten years. Wake is her first piece back in her home country, and presents a sophisticated filmic intelligence coming into contact with a post colonial sultars.



May Trubuhovich, Glenn Strandring and Tessa Laird are recent art school graduates. Each plays with different ideas regarding 'story'; deconstructing narrative in different ways.

Sean Kerr, composer of his own soundtracks, concentrates on visual and aural rhythm. Clap Attack is literally all rhythm, whereas Sound of the Land has a more ambient approach, and submerges rhythm into a more gentle aesthetic.

WAKE

Director/script: Annie Goldson 16mm, col, B&W, 30 mins, experimental documentary, 1993

An examination of NZ as 'the promised land' for immigrants. Utilising super-8 footage shot by her father in the 60s, art criticism, and documentary 'interview', Goldson examines questions of representation within media and culture. She also deals with issues of immigrant Pakehas being confronted by the Maori culture. A complex film which directly addresses Aotearoa's cultural complexity.
