

Animation breathes life into the banal minutiae of everyday existence. These two Sydney filmmakers remind us we have the imagination to create worlds beyond our immediate reality. Janet Merewether translates the bizarre humour of our modern existence through a technique where live action and animation are constantly colliding. The program will include her award winning $A \ Square's \ Safari$ (St Kilda Film Festival, Edinburgh Film Festival) as well as her most recent Freudian frolic $Tourette's \ Tics$. Janet began her study at Sydney College of the Arts then specialised in design at the Australian Film Television and Radio School. This year she has worked as Art Director on the Norman Gunston Show.

Kathy Smith's highly poetic style developed from studying Visual Communication Design at Sydney College of the Arts, a course which offered a mixture of fine arts, film and design. She transforms her own drawings, photos and oil paintings into movement and sound. The program features five works from the last ten years, including her recently completed 35mm short Living on the Comet. Created over a three year period, this film uses a recurring dream as a vehicle for examining and analyzing the various ways in which we interpret and evaluate the patterns of our lives.

"Animation" uses fantasy and imagery which cannot always be depicted in traditional cinema; metaphorically, metaphysically, metamorphosing one shape into another."
